Safety and security information: Arriving and departing from work

Security Services has engaged with UW Health Leaders, University Police, and the Madison Police Department to develop plans for the safe entry and exit of all staff members into and out of our places of work during the proposed work stoppage dates of September 13-16. Our top priority is to ensure our employees feel safe and secure in coming to work in order to provide care to our community.

This 3-page resource document provides FAQs as well as arrival and departure recommendations for staff working at UH, AFCH and EMH.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are we doing to provide support for staff who will not participate in the work stoppage but are worried about retaliation from the union or from colleagues who will be participating?

Answer: No intimidation, coercion or retaliation will be tolerated at UW Health. If you are concerned that you or a colleague may have been subjected to this type of unwanted behavior, you should report it to your next level leader or directly to Employee Relations.

# What support will we have for those staff who are worried about crossing the picket line? Will I physically have to push through it to enter my place of work?

Answer: Individuals who choose to picket should not threaten, harass or physically block or stop other employees who are reporting to work. As we learn more details about the protests, our security team will adjust as necessary to support the needs of our staff. Any interference with someone's ability to move freely in or around the facilities will be immediately addressed by security and law enforcement as needed. During the work stoppage there will be additional onsite security resources.

### Who do I contact if I encounter a concern on my way in?

Answer: Call Security Services at (608) 890-5555, and Security Services at East Madison Hospital at (608) 440-6666. Call 9-1-1 if you are in immediate risk or danger.

How should I arrive to and leave work for the day, specifically at University Hospital, AFCH, and East Madison Hospital if I want to avoid individuals participating in the work stoppage?

Response: On a large campus like University Hospital and AFCH there are many ways staff arrive for work based on their method of transportation and parking assignment. During the work stoppage staff should park in their assigned lot and plan extra time for arriving to the workplace. Staff should continue to use their UW Health ID badge to access the building as they normally would when arriving for work.




#### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

### University Hospital and American Family Children's Hospital

- The School of Pharmacy Skywalk is a great option for anyone who parks on the North side of the campus who normally parks in Ramp 76 or Lot 60. Your UW Health ID badge will allow access to secure doors along the travel route, including access to the School of Pharmacy and HSLC. Estimated walking time from the School of Pharmacy to University Hospital by using the skywalk is approximately 5 minutes. [See maps below]
- The WIMR front entrance across from the Nielson Tennis Center on Marsh Drive.
- Access to AFCH through Ramp 63 at the basement level on the staff elevator side of the building.
- Those who park in the Patient Ramp (Lot 75) can access University Hospital through the two designated employee entrances located between the hospital Main Entrance and Clinics Entrance.
- Employees that park in Lots 60, 76 and 131 may choose to use the UW Health Shuttle Service to the University Hospital Atrium Entrance. Service is provided weekdays from 5:50am to 9:30am and again between 2:00pm and 6:00pm. The shuttle arrives every 10 minutes.

  After-hour shuttle service is available from 6:00pm to 12:00am by calling (608) 444-0055.

#### ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

### **East Madison Hospital**

The two recommended entrances are Stairwell #7 and Stairwell #8 (see map and images below) located on the first floor on the Sports Performance side of the building. Staff should park in the parking ramp or the parking lots closest to the parking ramp. By vehicle consider using the Portage Road entrance driveway to arrive at the parking ramp area.
